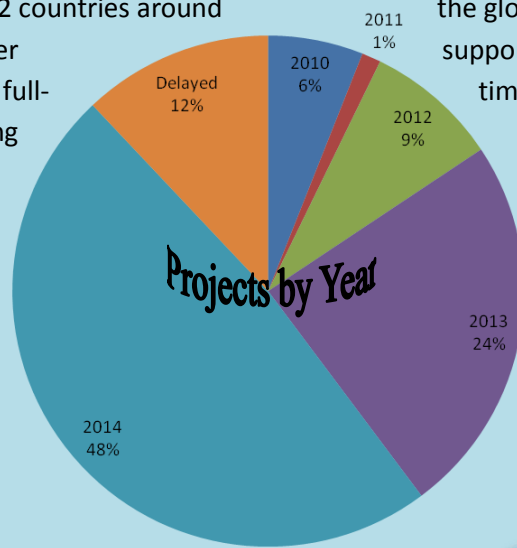


Project Baseline Annual Update 2014
